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PROJECTS

I. PROGRAMS FOR EDUCATION

A. THE PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM

Since the beginning of the pre-school operations in June 1999, Sta. Teresita Pre-School in Miarayon Centro, Bukidnon, has graduated 75 Kinder students, with 65 students currently in Grade School. The Sitio Abel branch which opened in 2001, has graduated 25 students who now can recognize letters and read simple words, write their names, and do basic addition and subtraction. All Sta. Teresita graduates are bursting with energy and are eager, confident learners.

Currently there are two native teachers in Miarayon Centro, and two native teachers in the Sitio Abel Branch. Sitio Abel has requested for the establishment of Grades 1 & 2 (at Grade 3 their kids are big enough to walk through the hi-way for around 40 minutes to get to the nearest elementary school). Elene Day Batistil, a current College Scholar will be trained to handle the non-formal grade 1 class starting SY 2004. The same classrooms will be used in the afternoon.

MILESTONES : One para-teacher has emerged from the group and is currently co-teaching with Mark, Coordinator for Adult education; one young adult was admitted into grade 3 at the elementary school; all learners acquired basic reading, writing, and numeracy skills; most want to do the elementary education certification course which will be funded partially by the Ford Foundation; Mark involved adult learners in livelihood initiatives (making of beaded necklaces, etc. for sale); 1 classroom was built pahina style and the program is expanding to 3 other sitios.

CHALLENGES AND DIFFICULTIES : Some drop-outs due to economic difficulties/community issues; need to develop better learning/teaching materials and manuals.

CHALLENGES AND DIFFICULTIES : Sustainability; the development of an indigenized curriculum and manual for teachers; training for school administration.

Adults are sometimes given milk supplements depending on donations received.

B. HEALTH AND MEDICAL

Held last March 2002 by Dr. Francis Dimalanta. De-worming medicines were prescribed and given to children and adults. Vitamins and other cough and cold medicines were also distributed to more than 100 children and adults in the area with the help of the other pilgrims.

MILESTONES:

- Through the formation of MRDC - Miarayon Region Development Cluster, the collaborative efforts of Tala-andig farmers (represented by MILALITRA-Miarayon, Lapok, and Lirongan Tribal Association), NGOs through Cartwheel Foundation, the Parish Priest, CAFFINORMIN-Chamber of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food Industries Of Northern Mindanao, Inc. of the private sector, LGUs represented by Mayor Noble and Vice Mayor Macapagay and the Office of the Presidential Adviser for Creating One (1) Million Jobs through Mr. Ben Albarece, and Task Force 63 were recognized for its aim of increasing household income of the Miarayon farmers.
- Programs include:
 - a. Organizing and Capability Building Program which addresses the following concerns:
 1. Organize a strong and stable farmers organization in Miarayon.
 2. Provide and facilitate skills training and capability building activities to enhance the farmer’s consciousness on modern farming technology and techniques.
 3. Conduct classroom and hands-on training.
 4. Create a Women’s cluster, which will recognize and emphasize their importance and role in community building.
 5. Build Techno-demo farms (targeted May 2003)
 6. Cross-visitation of farms with different crops/field trips to other/neighboring areas (Sharing of information, data, experiences and technology)

CHALLENGES AND DIFFICULTIES:

- Deadline for the submission of all requirements for application of Certificate of Ancestral Land Title (CALT) is June 2003 for Miarayon Lumads.

2. EDUCATION COUNCIL

The establishment of an education council is part of Cartwheel's community mobilization program. It involves the formation of a group of native leaders (composed of tribal leaders or alagads, and respected teachers in the community) who will determine the direction of the schools being set-up in the area of Miarayon, Talakag. They will serve as administrators, and will be trained to manage the schools when Cartwheel completely turns over operations to the community.

Mobilization of this group is set to start before this school year 2003-2003. Start-up funds for this will be provided by The Ford Foundation.

B. CULTURAL HERITAGE PRESERVATION

This program with varied components, such as : research and documentation of indigenous knowledge (dances, songs, stories, clothing), the establishment of a community library, visual and performing arts center, a techno demo farm, plus others, is still under development and planning. This year, 2003, construction of the community Library is due to begin through the assistance of the adult learners and funding from the British Embassy.
